Policy Statement:

SGNA monitors and supports legislative issues consistent with our mission and strategic plan. SGNA legislative activities will be communicated to the regional societies and membership.

Focus:

SGNA Regional Societies and Members

Purpose:

SGNA may support local, state and federal legislation that potentially impacts the practice of GI/endoscopy nursing.

Procedure:

Based on Board discussion of legislative, consumer activities and advocacy issues and relevancy to the current strategic plan, the following action may be taken:

- 1. Provide information to the Legislative Liaison & Healthcare Policy Committee.
 - a. Inform SGNA members about the issue (via *SGNA News* and/or eScope and/or Web site)
 - b. Influence the outcome of the issue (request to allocate resources)
 - c. Stay informed on the issue.

Legislative issues supported by SGNA may include:

- 1. Quality:
 - 1.1 Promoting quality patient outcomes in health care delivery systems.
 - 1.2 Evaluating and communicating the impact of heath policy on quality of care.
- 2. Access:

2.1 Increasing utilization of GI/endoscopy nurses in expanded roles such as nurse practitioners, nurse endoscopists, midwives and clinical specialists.

2.2 Increasing GI/endoscopy nursing representation in local, state and national health policy-making bodies.

3. Promotion of the public's health and safety:

3.1 Supporting public/private partnerships for health promotion and disease prevention.3.2 Supporting screening and preventive care.

- 4. Adequate Funding:
 - 4.1 Providing funding for GI/endoscopy nursing education, including scholarships on undergraduate, graduate and research levels
